

The Lawrence Centre Staff and Student Advisory Council continue to prepare for the 2011-2012 term. In November 2011, the Lawrence Centre and David Sparling, Agri-Food Innovation Regulations Chair at Ivey hosted the first in a series of workshops on Canada-US Regulatory Cooperation. Subsequent workshops on cross-border transportation and agri-food regulations will be held in early 2012.

We continue to focus on relevant public policy research where we partner with our Chair, Thomas d'Aquino, and our Lawrence Centre Advisory Council. We are looking forward to our Leaders' Symposium on November 29th, hosted by Manulife Financial, with the Norman Paterson School of International Affairs.

An effective dissemination strategy is an important part of the work we do at the Lawrence Centre. Meetings with representatives from various government ministries related to our ongoing work in Water Policy and Innovation, Green Energy, Climate Change, Canada-US Regulatory Cooperation, Canada-China relations, and Transportation issues are scheduled for the upcoming months.

Achievements and Events

November 2010 - October 2011

On October 11th Finance Minister Hon. Jim Flaherty delivered a keynote address entitled "Public Service is Good for You: A personal Perspective" to more than 300 students at the Richard Ivey School of Business. Following the presentation, Minister Flaherty met with Ivey Dean Carol Stephenson, Lawrence Centre Director Dianne Cunningham, faculty, staff and representatives from our Student Advisory Council to discuss current financial events and the link to public policy in Canada.

On September 28-30 Director Dianne Cunningham and Project Manager Melissa Harris participated in a series of policy events in Havana, Cuba with the support of Foreign Affairs and International Trade Canada. The two-day program was coordinated by Ambassador Matthew Levin at the Canadian embassy in Cuba and featured the Temas Debate, a public Forum to discuss contemporary policy issues, as well as presentations at The University of Havana and the Ministry of International Relations.





On August 15, Dianne Cunningham participated in a Roundtable discussion at The University of Western Ontario, chaired by Dean Carol Stephenson and hosted for Deputy Minister Bob Hamilton, Associate Secretary to the Treasury Board and Deputy Minister University Champion to The University of Western Ontario. Bob Hamilton was accompanied by Jing Xu of the Regulatory Cooperation Council Secretariat and the group discussed the Regulatory Cooperation Council's work under-



- On June 27, Dianne Cunningham was interviewed for Water Canada magazine to discuss outcomes from the Lawrence Centre's Water Innovation Forum and the subsequent report.
- On June 24, Lawrence Centre Director and staff attended a Continental Gateway Research Workshop, hosted by the Government of Canada, Government of Ontario and Government of Quebec. The purpose of the workshop was to provide the highlights of research on the economic benefits of trade through Ontario and the current capacity of the transportation modes.
- On June 22, Dianne Cunningham was interviewed for Ivey's Faculty Focus, to discuss the Lawrence Centre's new Water Innovation Report and the future of water management in Canada.



On June 14, the Lawrence Centre launched the Water Innovation Forum report at the Canadian Water Summit, in Toronto. Director, Dianne Cunningham, a featured panelist in the session "Smart Water Use in Canada's Agricultural Sector," highlighted four case studies involving innovative technological responses to challenges faced by the agricultural sector. The panel was chaired by Brock University Professor Steven Renzetti and also featured Dennis O'Grady from South Nation Conservation Authority and Hank Venema from the International Institute for Sustainable Development.

- On June 9, Lawrence Centre Policy Advisor Leslie Coates attended SWEA's General Assembly, "Growing Prosperity: Tapping into Rural-Urban Synergies" to witness the signing of a strategic alliance between SWEA and SCOR. The two regional economic development organizations will work together to expand and diversify the economy of Southwestern Ontario through their innovation and commercialization abilities
- On June 2, the Lawrence Centre participated in the Bloom Centre's Water Innovation Forum: Driving Adoption of Sustainable Water Solutions in Ontario's Food and Beverage Industry in Mississauga.
- On May 9, the Lawrence Centre participated in the symposium "Ontario and the Green Economy," sponsored by the Mowat Centre, Corporate Knights and Sustainable Prosperity, in Toronto. Leaders in business and policy discussed scaling up the investment and policy framework to accelerate Ontario's transition into a low-carbon and

- competitive green economy. Achim Steiner, Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme, highlighted how the environmental imperative for action is an opportunity for economic transformation.
- On February 24, Lawrence Centre Director and staff attended a roundtable discussion at the University of Waterloo with water expert and professor Rob de Loe and

representatives from the federal and provincial governments to discuss outcomes from the Lawrence Centre's Water Innovation Forum. Further consultation meetings are planned for the upcoming months to ensure that the workshop report includes relevant and timely public policy recommendations for consideration by business, government and academia.




Policy Framework (2013-2018). Our staff and students were pleased to have the opportunity to participate in this engaging event with Deputy Knubley.

A morning lecture was held at Ivey for more than 300 students, faculty and staff. More than 80 distinguished guests attended the evening dinner and speech in Toronto.


