

## MANAGERIAL ACCOUNTING AND CONTROL

The **Richard Ivey School of Business** seeks candidates for tenure-track **Assistant Professor/Associate Professor**, and tenured **Associate Professor/Professor** in the area of Accounting to begin in July 2012. The capability to teach introductory financial and management accounting courses and elective courses in degree-granting programs, is essential.
