Profile: Dr. Yaqi Shi

Ivey's newest Asian faculty member Dr. Yaqi Shi joined the school in July 2007. Originally from China's Shandong Province, Shi completed her Ph.D. in accounting at Montreal's Concordia University. Prior to her Ph.D. education, she worked as an accountant for Huaneng Power International Inc. (China), a world-leading power generating company.

A professor of managerial accounting and control, Shi's research interests not only focus on international accounting, but span the areas of corporate governance and emerging markets. She is currently conducting research on voluntary disclosure for international firms.

Gunnar Hedlund Award 2007

Chris Changwha Chung (Ivey Ph.D. 2006) was the recipient of the 2007 Gunnar Hedlund Award, an annual prize that honours the best Ph.D. thesis in the world in the field of International Business. Chung's thesis, titled "The Evolution of International Joint Ventures: Multiple Waves of Structural Change, Performance, and Survival" was presented at the 33rd EIBA Annual Conference at the University of Catania, Italy, in December 2007.

The award, launched in 1997 by the Boards of the Institute of International Business (IIB) at the Stockholm School of Economics, and the European International Business Academy (EIBA), recognizes works that have the greatest potential to impact the field of international business in the future.

Study gains worldwide attention

The study "Toy Import and Recall Levels: Is There a **Connection?"** published by the Asia Pacific Foundation of Canada showed that toy recalls in the U.S. have increased at a faster rate than the increase in imports from foreign countries. Also, designrelated recalls were higher, and increased faster, than manufacturing-related recalls, and that the trends were less pronounced for Chinesemade toys.

This study co-authored by Ivey Professor Paul Beamish, University of Manitoba Professor Hari Bapuji (Ivey Ph.D. 2005) and Andre Laplume follows the authors' earlier research which showed that most toy recalls in the U.S. were the result of design flaws by the creator companies rather than attributed to Chinese manufacturers.
