

Hebei Dawu Group: Building the First "Family Business Constitution" in China

Yuping Du Teaching Note: 8B11M38

This case examines the "Family Business Constitution" created by Dawu Group's founder, Sun Dawu. It was the only such system in China to date. The system made it possible for the group to survive near-fatal challenges. The case starts with challenges Sun Dawu encountered: a salary-rise request from a recently elected board member; some managers' doubts about the constitution system; and the suspicion of external experts and journalists of the group's elections. One of the issues the family business owner faced was whether it was possible to solve the internal challenges and

external doubts about family business succession and governance and, if so, how.


