Inaugural Ivey China Case Competition

Organized by the Ivey Alumni Association Shanghai Chapter, the first Ivey Case Competition in China will take place over the weekend of April 16-17, 2005 in Shanghai.

Six teams from top undergraduate business programs in Shanghai will participate. Each competing team will be given a written case about a real business situation in a real company. The teams must then identity and analyze the issues, and develop a plan to resolve the issues faced by the case company. A panel of judges drawn from academics and the business community will listen to the presentations of the teams' deliberations. The overall winning team will receive the Ivey Case Competition Trophy and a sponsored trip to Hong Kong where they will have a chance to visit Ivey's campus, the Cheng Yu Tung Management Institute, attend classes with Ivey students in the HK MBA and EMBA programs, and network with Ivey alumni.

Ivey students are responsible for the design and fund raising for the project. Construction of the house will take place April 1-21, 2005. A national conference on "What is Corporate Social Responsibility?" will conclude the project on April 22. The conference will feature topics on CSR with guest speakers including Ralph Nader, Avi Friedman and Stephen Lewis.


